

Kids were all looking smart in their new tour merchandise and matching initialled backpacks, we could spot them from a mile away.

The energy in the group was brilliant, both teams excited and itching to play some rugby, which they did. A very impressive determined bunch of young athletes from the onset.

Upon arrival into sunny Brisbane we settled into our luxurious accommodation in the heart of the Gabba district. Pizza by the pool for dinner followed by an evening of watching the Wallabies play Argentina at the local sports bar Although the Wallabies didn't come away with the win, our players were amped and in the mood for rugby ahead of their 1st match on Sunday.

Vale Howard and Helen Clay

Howard Clay 1932 -2023

Howard died last Friday (25/8/23) in Keri Keri New Zealand ten days after his 92nd birthday. He had been in reasonable health until he fell and broke his collar bone about 6 weeks ago – this led to a rapid decline.

Howard was a passionate Kiwi even though he was born in Lismore NSW (that was a carefully guarded secret) and only moved to NZ some years later. As a teenager and young man in Dunedin he was imbued with Rugby even though he couldn't play due to the enduring effects of a serious bone disease contracted as a boy.

He came to Old Collegians in 1955 and almost immediately became a very active member. He edited the newsletter for a number of years (back in the days when it was hard copy and mailed out weekly), was a committee member, served as President and was made a Life Member.

However, his major achievement for the Club was to be a key member of the group that established junior rugby – an enduring legacy! He remained an active club member until the move back to NZ after retirement.

Howard's wife Helen, who was also an influential member of the Club together with their three offspring. Simon played for OC's and now lives in Daylesford, Vic.; Sarah did a lot of physio work for OC players and now lives in Perth; and Rebecca who lives in Keri.

Howard will be remembered as a generous person always willing to help. He was a "thinker" with forthright opinions. Helen and Howard were always generous hosts. For those that knew him I will add that he died with a suitable amount of cantankerousness'.

We were also saddened to hear of the recent passing of Helen Clay last night 31/08/23, our thoughts are with the family.

Season Round-up

What a season our u12 squad has had. They have shown remarkable growth, determination and spirit and the squad itself has grown exponentially in both skill and numbers.

We started the year with 19 players of varying skill and capacity and have finished with a squad of 25, well drilled and capable Rugby players. Every single one of them showing significant improvement across all facets of their game; skill, discipline, leadership, respect, and versatility.

Skill in tactical play and strategy.

Discipline in behaviour, understanding themselves and others as part of a whole.

Leadership as both player, mentor, supporter, and teammate.

Respect of self and others – understanding everyone has a job to do and ensuring you are doing yours, to the best of your ability, for the greater good of the team.

Versatility - learning to embrace change and accept the challenge that it may offer.

The transition from a group of individuals to a cohesive squad, working as a well drilled machine, is a testament to the dedication and hard work of the players and coaching team. The backs were continuously drilled in catch and pass technique and the forwards were schooled the fundamentals of rucking. Then, together during team runs, creating structured links between the two, developing dynamic and disciplined transitions that are seamless in both attack and defence. The group worked hard together to link play and convert opportunities as a team rather than individuals. ...and as we find ourselves at the pointy end of the season, we have a group of players who can perform the basics in their sleep which is a great testament to their drive and determination to be a great team.

The team's progress in their approach to game day has also transitioned from a fragmented playing style to a unified strategy, reflected in a team that understands how to execute simple rugby well and delivers every time. They are definitively watchable. The rise up the ladder has reflected their dedication and collective improvement. Finishing second is a remarkable accomplishment, and it's a testament to their hard work, determination, and is a clear reflection of their growth as a team throughout the season.

The transition to finals marks an exciting phase in the team's journey. With the foundation of discipline, teamwork, and skill development, as a team they are well-prepared to face the challenges that lie ahead. 
