Old Collegians 64 v Souths 19

Old Collegians had early possession in the Souths 22 but could not convert it to points and looked unsettled in the first 15 minutes, with dropped passes, missed set-piece opportunities and not enough communication. Souths had the benefit of a strong wind and kicked well to push Old Colls back and pressure in a very physical attack, offloading often and targeting slow defence to grab the first try. Old Colls tried to keep ball in hand and run out of the 22 to nullify the breeze, but Souths were adept at stripping in the tackle and turning over the rucks, putting Old Colls back in defence.

Eventually Old Colls rallied and, after a lineout win in the defensive half, Bartlett broke through the midfield to take play back into attacking range where Sadler kept the phases turning over quickly, leading to Jhuan Roux scoring under the posts in his first grade debut. Souths reapplied the pressure and looked ominously like they could score 2 or 3 more tries, but Old Colls' defence tightened up and South's discipline let them down with several relieving penalties. As half time approached Old Colls had a centre field scrum about 15m out and 5/8 Curtin wrong-footed the defence, stepping back in 10m out for a try which Sadler converted for a 14-7 lead at the break.

The second half was much improved by Old Collegians in communication, aggression, structure and support play. Gary Mann, Benny Blackall and Fraser Murison all put in hard runs from the kick off to get play into 22 where the backs went through the hands and Curtin picked out Liam McDonough on the left touch-line for his first try. A lapse of attention on the restart let the ball bounce and Souths seized it, rushing up the field and their backs went the blindside from centerfield to catch some slow defenders out and scored.

Souths attacked again but Old Colls secured a turnover on halfway and Tim Dawes hoofed an unlikely kick downfield that was secured with a good chase, then punched up by Bartlett and finished by Kyle Fleetwood-Pieper. Souths put the restart long and Wes Billett pulled in a lineout on the defensive 5m line which the backs took wide, as Curtin & Busby combined to get play to the attacking 22 where Souths conceded a penalty. Old Colls took a lineout and went wide to Fleetwood-Pieper up the right wing, then took it back wide left for Curtin & Busby to tip-on quickly for McDonough to score his second. Souths failed to put the restart 10m and the forwards secured the scrum, allowing the backs to dart right and Busby took the last defender before offloading to Fleetwood-Pieper for his second try with a 40m run.

Souths were still playing a very physical game and threatened when they had possession, helped when Old Colls gave away a series of penalties that Souths punished with a try following a quick-tap. Old Colls put in a long restart and the forwards grabbed a turnover in the 22 forcing the ball loose from a Souths ruck, where Roux ninja'd both sides by kicking and regathering from 15m out for his second score.

Dave Alo-Emile made a big impact off the bench, running the restart back to 30m out and the subsequent phases took the attack to 10m from the line where Curtin again outmanoeuvred the defence stepping back in to score. Old Colls took advantage of another penalty to set a line-out on the 22 that the backs took to the midfield, and Bartlett showed some vintage form to bust through the defence on the inside to go under the dot. Souths put the kick-off long once more and Old Colls showed good hands and support play to return to the South's 22 where Busby put the finishing touch to skip past the Souths 5/8 and take the final score to 64-19.

It was the right day to win the toss. An unrelenting northerly blowing straight down the Tregenza pitch made running with it an easy choice. What followed was undoubtedly the best half of rugby we have played all season. We held a great line across the park, we worked structured, powerful phase play through the forwards, we ran clean lines, our line speed was excellent, communications and team work intuitive, all of which lead to five tries and five conversions, all off Stu Robertson's boot, in the first half. When Souths did get their hands on the ball we clinically took them back at a rate of 5 metres a phase. And they weren't helped when their tight head prop was sent to the bin with 15 minutes played. The front row combination of Luke Clifton, (the trim breaded) Nic Howlett and David Alo-Emile were outstanding, particularly David who was virtually unstoppable and well rewarded with a hat-tick of tries on the day. Our line-out functioned perfectly with Al Ward dominating. The dominance of the forwards freed creative opportunities for the backs. Not so say this was a physically soft encounter, with several of the guys commenting at the end of the game that the tackling was seriously hard work. 33 - 0 at half time.

The second half, pretty much as the first. Perhaps not the same total control but still, we didn't really give Souths a sniff. Another four tries followed. Kicking into the wind made conversions trickier but Stu still made two of four. This was a professional, unrelentingly and thoroughly pleasurable performance to watch. A credit to all our players.

No surprise that David Alo-Emile was adjudged the best player with both Stu Robertson and Jon Mokomoko outstanding.

On Saturday 20th July we welcomed Southern Suburbs to Tregenza Oval. It was a beautiful morning and we played in excellent conditions. This was by far our smallest U12's playing group taking the field since the start of the season, with lots of players still away during the school holidays. Having strong numbers in our U12's still allowed us to field 17 eager players on the day.

Jackson Denley opened the scoreboard for us almost straight from the kick-off, followed by a successful conversion from Ivan. Southern Suburbs had very little possession for most of the game and we managed to run in several beautiful team tries during the remainder of the first half by Tyson Hazzard, Thamsanqa Pule & Ivan Arnold (2), to take us to a half time lead of 27 - 0. It wasn't our most convincing performance to date, although we kept the opposition scoreless. We looked a little rusty at times and have not had regular training sessions during the school holidays. Our coaches reminded our playing group at the half time break, of the importance to maintain our structure and good tackling technique. Several attempts to rip the ball of the opposition instead of making good tackles were also discussed.

It was very pleasing to see how our U12's took the coaches advice onboard as we executed our game plan far better during the second half. We started the second half strong, with Will Tanner running up hard and breaking the opposition's defence line. He ran the ball up strongly and managed to beautifully regain his balance. We gained massive territory in the process, which then allowed Noah Wilson who beautifully positioned himself to support Will, to dart across the line. Ivan successfully converted. Shortly after Thomas King broke around the fringes of the scrum for another 5 points. We kept applying pressure on the Souths pack and with good ball in hand and forward momentum we dominated most aspects of the game.

We gave good ball to our backline, which allowed Ollie Collins following several quality passes through the hands to dart across the line for our 3^{rd} try during the second half. Ivan successfully converted. Thamsanqa Pule used his beautiful sidestep and pace to out manoeuvre the opposition, he was well supported by Charlie Kinniburgh who finished off another beautiful try, with Ivan converting. Shortly after Thamsanqa Pule crossed the line for our final and 10^{th} try of the day, Ivan successfully converted. At the final whistle we were up 60-0.

Our ability to control the possession, setting up phases and using the width of the field allowed us to capitalise on our opportunities. We also tackled much better in the second half, which allowed us to dominate most of the play.
